The session, held from 3 PM to 4 PM in the VSAP Auditorium, featured an informative talk by Dr. Monisha Deepika an expert in obstetrics, gynecology, infertility, reproductive medicine, and laparoscopic surgery from Deepika Women's Hospital, Madhapur. She highlighted the alarming statistics of cervical cancer, its link to HPV, and the importance of early detection and vaccination. The initiative aimed to educate students preventive on measures, reinforcing the message that "Her Fight is Our Fight."
